The Broadway Education Alliance is pleased to welcome you to The Roger Rees Awards for Excellence in Student Performance. The mission of the program is to promote the educational value of musical theater in schools, as well as celebrate emerging talent – on stage, backstage, and off stage.

The Broadway Education Alliance and educational partners present a portfolio of awards and recognition opportunities for theater arts students. These opportunities\* include:

- The Roger Rees Awards for Outstanding Performance in a Musical awarded to two students who performed in qualifying roles in their high school's musical. These two students go on to represent the Greater New York City area at The Broadway League Foundation's National High School Musical Theatre Awards<sup>®</sup> (NHSMTA<sup>®</sup>), The Jimmy Awards<sup>®</sup>.
- **New Faces Honors for Excellence in Solo Performance** acknowledges thirty (30) students for their dedication and excellence in their craft of acting, dancing, and/or singing. Open to students grades 9-12, this recognition track offers various educational and scholarship opportunities.
- **The Harmony Helper® Award for Excellence in Choral Group Performance** showcases high school choral groups around the region. One group is awarded the Harmony Helper<sup>®</sup> prize package along with the opportunity to perform on stage at The Roger Rees Awards Showcase.
- The Student Reporter Search features students with an interest in media marketing or journalism. One student will be selected as the Roger Rees Awards Student Reporter. This student will co-host The Roger Rees Awards Showcase Pre-Show as well as be submitted to The Jimmy Awards' Student Reporter Contest for a chance to serve as The Jimmy's Student Reporter.

# \*Awards, recognition opportunities, and scholarships may vary each year based on sponsors and educational partners.

### **Requirements for High School Participation**

#### SCHOOL REPRESENTATIVE

High Schools in the designated Roger Rees Awards (RRA) region that are interested in participating in any award track offered by the program must submit a new registration each school year. Schools must designate **one representative** who will be the point-of-contact. This person must be an **employee or contractor of the school.** The School Representative will be responsible for registering the school and will receive all communications from the RRA team. Upon registration, the School Representative will receive additional materials including all necessary links and forms for participation.

#### REGION

As of the 2023-2024 school year, any public or private high school located in the following counties may register for participation: Bronx, Dutchess, Kings (Brooklyn), Nassau, New York (Manhattan), Orange, Putnam, Queens, Richmond (Staten Island), Rockland, Suffolk, Sullivan, Ulster, and Westchester.

As dictated by program funding, sponsorship, and the high volume of school interest, we are unable to accept school applications from outside of these counties or from New Jersey.

#### REGISTRATION

A registration fee of **\$200** will be charged to all participating schools. This fee helps cover administrative and production costs of the program and provide unique educational experiences for student participants. *Registration fee is waived for Title 1 Schools.* 

Payments may be made via the online registration form using a credit/debit card, OR a check can be mailed. #### **DEADLINE FOR REGISTRATION**

Schools should be registered a minimum of two weeks prior to their musical performance dates (if participating in the Outstanding Performer Award category) and in no case later then the registration deadline of **January 31, 2024.** A maximum of 70 schools will be accepted. Registration will be closed once the program hits capacity.

#### AWARD CATEGORIES

Registered schools are eligible to participate in any or all award categories presented during the current season. Each category has its own specific guidelines and requirements. Please carefully review the details of each category. We highly encourage submitting students in ALL categories to maximize opportunities and recognition for students.

### 2023-2024 Roger Rees Awards Showcase

The 2023-2024 Roger Rees Awards Showcase will take place on Sunday, May 19, 2024, at 4:30pm. Location to be announced. Showcase tickets will go on sale in early May.



### **Award Categories**

Below are the details and guidelines for each award/recognition category. Please carefully review each section as participation requirements vary.

### THE ROGER REES AWARD FOR OUTSTANDING PERFOMANCE IN A MUSICAL – Guidelines

The Roger Rees Award for Outstanding Performer in a Musical recognizes student performers from Greater New York Area high schools for distinction in performance. The two (2) student winners of this award will go on to represent The Roger Rees Awards at The National High School Musical Theatre Awards<sup>®</sup> (NHSMTA<sup>®</sup>), also known as The Jimmy Awards<sup>®</sup>.

#### SCHOOL/STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

All public and private high schools located in the eligible regions presenting an officially licensed edition of a NHSMTA® approved Broadway musical during the current academic year are eligible to submit students for participation. Students performing a qualifying role as defined by the NHSMTA® are eligible for in-school adjudication.

The school must be registered by the school representative a minimum of 2 weeks prior to their show dates. To meet programmatic deadlines, ALL participating shows should take place prior to April 21, 2024.

#### AWARD TRACK OVERVIEW

**PLEASE NOTE: There have been changes made to the in-school adjudication and nominee selection process. If your school has participated in previous years, please carefully review this section.** Based on educators' feedback, these changes have been made with careful consideration to expand and elevate the educational benefits of our program for all participating schools.

School Representatives are responsible for managing the in-school adjudication phase of the program. All interested students performing an eligible role in their musical should be evaluated by a team of unbiased Adjudicators using the RRA rubric. Based on the Adjudicators scores, this evaluation process will identify the top two students to be submitted to The Roger Rees Awards who will move onto the Nominee Selection Phase.



The **Nominee Selection Phase** will involve an in-person vocal audition in front of a panel of Broadway professionals and an educational workshop that will take place at one of three locations based on the geographic location of the school. See below for dates and corresponding counties; locations to be announced. Qualifying students should keep their corresponding audition date open. These sessions will give students the unique opportunity to participate in a professionally run audition to gain experience in a supportive educational setting.

Friday, May 3: Bronx, Kings (Brooklyn), New York (Manhattan), Queens, Richmond (Staten Island) Saturday, May 4: Nassau, Suffolk Sunday, May 5: Dutchess, Orange, Putman, Rockland, Sullivan, Ulster, Westchester

The Nominee Selection Phase (in-person audition) will result in fifty (50) students being selected as the official "Nominees" for The Roger Rees Award for Outstanding Performer in a Musical. These students will attend The Roger Rees Awards Weekend and perform in The Roger Rees Awards Showcase. The RRA Weekend will be held on **May 17, 18 & 19, 2024**. The two (2) Outstanding Performer winners of The Roger Rees Awards will be offered the opportunity to represent The Greater NYC Area at The Jimmy Awards<sup>®</sup> in June.

#### IN-SCHOOL ADJUDICATION DETAILED

In accordance with the NHSMTA's eligibility requirements, The Roger Rees Awards has instituted an adjudication process whereby each participating school must identify a minimum of three (3) credentialed and impartial theater professionals to serve as adjudicators for the eligible roles of their high school production.

#### ADJUDICATOR ELIGIBILITY

Adjudicators must be impartial theater professionals with at least one of the following qualifications:

- A degree or professional certification in music, theatre, dance, or other aspect of performing arts with at least 5 years of professional experience
- Membership in one of the Broadway Industry unions or guilds, with at least 5 years of experience in the professional theatre
- At least 5 years of experience as a teacher or teaching artist of any aspect of the performing arts at the high school or college level
- An industry professional with at least 5 years of experience in theatre arts education, audience development and/or youth enrichment

Note: Adjudicators should NOT be faculty of the school, directly involved with the musical production, or a family-member of the cast or crew.



#### **IMPORTANT CHANGE:**

School representatives will manage **ALL** the in-school adjudication process including:

- (1) Vetting and securing unbiased Adjudicators
- (2) Providing Adjudicators with instructions and the official RRA scoring rubrics
- (3) Collecting and tabulating scores to determine the top two scoring students
- (4) Submitting a copy of the of final score tally of all students adjudicated to the RRA

(5) Completing the RRA form to submit top two (2) students to move onto the "Nominee Selection Phase"

The Roger Rees Awards team will provide school representatives with:

- (1) Rubric and scoring systems for Adjudication
- (2) Form to submit the two top scoring students
- (3) An example "final score tally" for reference

In response to feedback we've received, this process allows for school representatives to collaborate more closely with Adjudicators and arrange for providing post-performance feedback to the students to help them further develop their skills.

Once Adjudication has occurred, the school representative will use the provided form to submit student information as well as a copy of the final score sheet to the Roger Rees Awards team within **ONE (1) WEEK** following their show. (See page 16 for Student Submission Form questions). Upon the RRA team receiving student information from the school representative, parents/guardians of the selected students will be required to officially register their student for participation in The Roger Rees Awards.

The top two (2) students from each school will need to be available on the date of their designated inperson audition. Locations will be announced. The duration of the audition/workshop will be approximately 2-2.5 hours. Students should also be available May 17, 18 & 19 for The Roger Rees Awards weekend should they be selected as one of the 50 Nominees. If one of your top scoring students is NOT willing or able to participate on all dates mentioned, please submit an alternate student based off inschool adjudication scores.



#### STUDENT REGISTRATION

A parent/legal guardian is required to complete an online registration for their student's participation in the program. This registration must be completed in its entirety to be considered for the Nominee Selection phase of the program. (See page 17 for registration questions and requirements). Registered students will receive the details for the Nominee Selection Phase.

One requirement of student registration will include providing a **2-2** ½ **minute song cut** from a solo song they performed in their musical. Theater Educators and Musical Directors are a valuable resource as they can provide students support in acquiring sheet music, making appropriate cuts if necessary to meet the guidelines and assist with preparing students for success. This music cut will be the students audition song during the Nominee Selection Phase, The Roger Rees Awards coaching and finalist selection, AND could be used for The Jimmy Awards. Ensure that this is a cut your student is happy with and confident performing.

#### NOMINATIONS ANNOUCEMENTS

Following the "Nominee Selection Phase," students will be notified **on or around** May 7, 2024 if they have been selected as a Roger Rees Award Nominee. This information will be emailed to the email address that was provided during registration. An immediate response will be required either ACCEPTING or DECLINING the Nomination and confirming the student is willing and available to participate in the Roger Rees Awards Weekend and Showcase as well as willing and available to participate in The Jimmy Awards in June. Nominees will be publicly announced via press release shortly thereafter and the Nominee List will be posted on The Roger Rees Awards website.

#### **ROGER REES AWARDS WEEKEND**

The Roger Rees Awards Rehearsal, Coaching and Showcase weekend will take place on Friday, May 17 (approx. 4pm-8pm), Saturday, May 18 (approx. 8am–5pm) and Sunday, May 19 (approx. 8am–6pm), locations to be announced. Nominees must be available for the entirety of the weekend program.

Friday will kick off with an introduction to the program and showcase rehearsals begin. Saturday will consist of rehearsals and coaching sessions. During the coaching sessions, nominees will work with a Broadway Coach and Music Director on their solo song cut from their qualifying role. All Nominees will perform in the Opening and Closing numbers of The Roger Rees Awards Showcase.

Rehearsals continue Sunday culminating in The Roger Rees Awards Showcase at 4:30PM. During the showcase 12 finalists will be announced live, and those students will perform their solo song cuts. Their performances will be scored by a panel of distinguished judges to determine two (2) Outstanding Performers and two (2) Emerging Artists. The Outstanding Performer winners and their parents/guardians will be provided with further instructions for participation in The Jimmy Awards.

The Roger Rees Awards Showcase is open to the public and tickets will be available for purchase. All family and friends are invited to attend. The Showcase will begin at 4:30 PM and run approximately 1.5 hours.



### <u>NEW FACES HONORS FOR EXCELLENCE IN SOLO PERFORMANCE –</u> <u>Guidelines</u>

#### AWARD TRACK OVERVIEW

Presented by the Broadway Education Alliance (BEA) and Casting Society of America, the New Faces Honors was developed to expand access to recognition and training for students outside of the lead roles of a musical AND for students attending schools that may not produce a traditional musical. Established in 2021, New Faces recognizes excellence in solo performances by students, grades 9-12, pursuing education or training in acting, dance, and singing – in any genre.

The name "New Faces" is inspired by *New Faces of 1952*, a musical revue with songs, dances, and comedy sketches that ran on Broadway for nearly a year. Later made into a movie and a TV Show, many top entertainers of the day began their careers with a performance on this program with winners occasionally going on to great success in the entertainment industry.

#### AWARD TRACK DETAILED

Schools that are registered for participation in The Roger Rees Awards, may invite up to eight (8) students from their school to submit an audition video in any or all three performance categories. Audition videos will be reviewed by a panel of professional casting directors, and up to ten (10) students from each category will be recognized with "Top Honors".

There is not one specific "winner" in the New Faces Honors program. These 30 students (10 per category) will have an equal opportunity to be selected for various scholarship and exclusive training opportunities based on their audition videos. All Top Honors Students will be recognized during the New Faces Honors Ceremony (date and location to be announced) and names will appear in the Roger Rees Awards Playbill. They will receive a 2-hour workshop in their specific performance category taught by top Broadway industry professionals – date/time to be announced.

#### STUDENT ELIGIBILITY

Students, grades 9-12, who attend at high school registered for participation in The Roger Rees Awards for Excellence in Student Performance, are eligible for participation. Students do NOT have to be cast in the school's musical production. This is an opportunity to recognize talented students outside of the musical setting who may excel in a singing, dance, or acting. We encourage School Representatives to involve drama, choral departments, and/or extracurricular clubs to engage students.

Note: The two students who are submitted for the Outstanding Performer Award are NOT eligible for the New Faces Honors Program.



#### SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

School representatives will be provided with the information required for students to submit an audition for the New Faces Honors track. If selected for Top Honors, parents/guardians will be sent the information needed to officially register their students for participation in the in-person workshops and recognition events.

#### AUDITIONS

Students may choose to submit an audition video in any or all of the performance categories: acting, singing, and/or dance. Submissions should be personal to the student. There are no parameters with regards to the genre or style, the goal is to highlight each student's interests and strengths.

#### ADJUDICATION

All video auditions will be reviewed by a panel of industry casting agents to determine the top 10 in each category. Other educational partners will have the opportunity to review the submissions of the Top Honors students and present additional scholarships and prizes.



### HARMONY HELPER AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN CHORAL GROUP PERFORMANCE – Guidelines

#### AWARD TRACK OVERVIEW

Broadway Education Alliance is proud to partner with Harmony Helper<sup>®</sup> and The Goren Family Foundation to present the Harmony Helper Award for Excellence in Choral Group Performance. This award celebrates the artistry and creativity of high school choral groups and rewards the talent, dedication, and teamwork essential in choral music.

#### CHORAL GROUP ELIGIBILITY

Schools registered for participation in the current season of The Roger Rees Awards are eligible to submit a choral group for consideration for the Harmony Helper Award.

Choirs or student vocal groups should feature a minimum of 4 students. The song performed for the video submission should be an approved licensed arrangement performed during the current academic year.

#### SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Detailed instructions for submitting videos will be sent upon completion of school registration for The Roger Rees Awards Program.

- School Representative will submit a video of the student choral performance.
- Song selection may be in any genre including contemporary pop/rock show choir, a cappella vocal ensemble, musical theatre, or any other style that be represents the group's vocal skills and performance capabilities. While the song may be a musical theater song, it should not be a video clip from a musical production.
- Record an introduction that includes the name of the school and group, any background on the program, and an introduction to the piece being submitted. The introduction should not exceed 60 seconds.
- Produce a video of the choral performance. Piece should not exceed 4 minutes. Pay close attention to lighting and sound.

#### ADJUDICATION

Videos will be reviewed by a panel of judges from Harmony Helper that will include theatre industry professionals and music directors. The top scoring choir will be invited to perform at The Roger Rees Awards Showcase as well as receive additional prizes.

#### SHOWCASE PERFORMANCE

The Roger Rees Awards Showcase will take place on Sunday, May 19, 2024, location to be announced. The choir, choir director, and chaperones will receive instructions for arrival and on-stage rehearsal/sound check prior to the showcase.



### Student Reporter Search – Guidelines

#### **RECOGNITION OVERVIEW**

The Student Reporter Search is an opportunity for students with an interest in media marketing and journalism to explore their passions and share their talents. The student with the winning submission will be invited to appear as the co-host for The Roger Rees Awards Pre-Show, where they will interview special guests. This student will also be invited to represent the Greater New York Region in The Jimmy Awards<sup>®</sup> National Student Reporter Search. (Requires additional application submitted to The Jimmy Awards).

#### **STUDENT ELIGIBILITY**

Students of registered schools, grades 9 -12, with an interest in media marketing and/or journalism, are eligible to participate.

#### SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Requirements for participation may vary each year based on Award partners. Guidelines for the 2024 Student Reporter Search will be announced at a later date and provided to all School Representatives.
