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

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#### THE ROGER REES AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN STUDENT PERFORMANCE

celebrates the exceptional life and career-long artistic excellence of the beloved actor, artist and teacher, Roger Rees.



Roger Rees was born in Aberystwyth, Wales on May 5, 1944, and grew up in South London. He began his career in the theater as a scenery painter. While working backstage, the theater manager called upon him to replace an injured cast-member. He never painted scenery again.

He spent 22 years as a member of the Royal Shakespeare Company with whom he received the Olivier® and Tony® Awards for his performance in the title role in *The Life and Adventures of Nicholas Nickleby*. Roger continued as an

Associate Artist of the RSC for the rest of his life. Over the course of his career Roger starred in dozens of plays and musicals produced on Broadway and the West End of London. Broadway audiences cheered his performance of Gomez opposite the Morticia played by Bebe Neuwirth and Brooke Shields in *The Addams Family*, and raved about his portrayal of Anton Schell starring opposite Chita Rivera in *The Visit*. Television audiences know him from recurring roles on *The West Wing, Cheers* and *Grey's Anatomy*; and guest appearances on dozens of other shows.

Roger was also a prolific director who whose work graced the stages of many world-class theater companies including the Williamstown Theatre Festival where he served as the artistic director. A new generation of theatergoers were introduced to his extraordinary artistry when he teamed with Alex Timbers to direct *Peter and the Starcatcher* by Rick Elice, for which he won the Obie Award for Outstanding Direction Off-Broadway and then garnered nine Tony nominations, including one for Best Direction of a Play.

Throughout his life, Roger was a committed educator and generous mentor to young artists. From his earliest days as a fledgling with the Royal Shakespeare Company when he traveled to schools in the Cotswolds on Sundays, to the master-craftsman courses at Columbia University (adjunct professor), Williams College (Honorary Doctor of Fine Arts, 2006) and Florida State University (Hoffman Chair); from community outreach he began as Artistic Director of the Bristol Old Vic to the Leap-Frog internships he pioneered as Artistic Director of Williamstown Theater Festival, Roger spent countless hours in rehearsals and classrooms coaching aspiring writers, directors and performers on character, craft, collaboration and the vast cannon of theatrical works. The Roger Rees Award for Excellence in Student Performance continues his work.

Roger Rees passed away in July 2015 after a year-long battle with brain cancer. He was posthumously inducted into the American Theater Hall of Fame in November 2015. ↑ ↑ hen I had the opportunity to play Frank Jr. in Catch Me If You Can at my high school, I had started to dive into the Jimmy Awards YouTube wormhole. I had already heard of the Jimmy Awards, but the seemingly distant dream of being a part of that extraordinary group began to present itself more and more as something that I'd really love to do. I researched how exactly one got to the Jimmys and found The Roger Rees Awards. I fell into a wormhole of Roger Rees Awards videos, winners, finalists, and nominees just as obsessively as I had for the Jimmy Awards, and this dream seemed even farther away. Every single person was magnificent in their own way. As I had begun to discuss this idea with friends of mine and show them these RRA videos, they outright told me how unlikely and ridiculous this dream was. I believed them, but I persisted.

My wonderful, wonderful theatre teacher at my school, Mrs. Tasha Partee, submitted

my costars and I for The Roger Rees Awards as soon as I'd mentioned the idea to her. I anxiously awaited the nominees list and was ecstatic to see my name on the list. The morning of the awards, my mother and I had a serious discussion about how unlikely it was that I'd be a finalist, and how lucky I was just to be in that room. It was all absolutely true. The amazing people at RRA (my coach was the incredible Robin Lewis with whom I've since been in correspondence multiple times) injected me with such confidence and the best advice, that I felt invincible and so lucky just to be there that day. Then, being chosen as a finalist and performing for the amazing panel of judges with my heart beating out of my chest, and then winning and Celia Keenan-Bolger, Queen of All Queens, hugging me as I was handed the award...I mean, it was a crazy day.

My life hasn't been the same since RRA. If I hadn't played Frank Jr., been chosen as

an RRA nominee, won the RRA and gone to the Jimmy Awards, I wouldn't have had the incredible, life-changing, indescribable opportunity of playing Evan Hansen on Broadway. That's at face value, but on a deeper level, I couldn't do what I'm doing now if I hadn't learned the lessons that I learned from Robin on that day at The Roger Rees Awards, listened to the stories shared by the panel of judges, or seen the rest of those unbelievably talented people perform that day. High school is scary as is. Seeing so many high schoolers overcome their fears and perform not only for such a legendary panel of judges, but for their peers who they were undeniably comparing themselves to, just as I was? It was just so inspiring, and it still inspires me to this day.

me in my run in *Dear Evan Hansen*, and it was a beautiful, full circle moment for me. I am so thankful to have her in my life.

Needless to say, The Roger Rees Awards was a life-changer. On the top shelf in my room are my Roger Rees Award, my Jimmy Award, and the first cast I ever put on in my first photo shoot for *Dear Evan Hansen*. In an undeniable plethora of ways, I would never have the other two without my Roger Rees Award.

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

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
#### ROGER REES AWARD HOSTS

PATRICIA HOAG SIMON has served as Coordinator for Musical Theatre at Marymount Manhattan College since 1991. She supervises a faculty of over forty musical theatre professionals in the fields of music theatre history, music theory, dance, private voice, auditioning, and acting for musical theatre. Pat has taught many courses including Musical Theatre Techniques, Scene into Song and Auditioning for Musicals, as well as directed Baby, She Loves Me, The Grass Harp, The Human Heart, Plain and Fancy, Carousel, The Human Comedy, Ragtime, South Pacific, Cabaret and Fiddler on the Roof.
