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

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

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

THE ROGER REES AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN STUDENT PERFORMANCE

celebrates the exceptional life and career-long artistic excellence of the beloved actor, artist and teacher, Roger Rees.



Roger Rees was born in Aberystwyth, Wales on May 5, 1944, and grew up in South London. He began his career in the theater as a scenery painter. While working backstage, the theater manager called upon him to replace an injured cast-member. He never painted scenery again.


He spent 22 years as a member of the Royal Shakespeare Company with whom he received the Olivier* and Tony* Awards for his performance in the title role in *The Life and Adventures of Nicholas Nickleby*. Roger continued as an Associate Artist of the RSC for the rest

of his life. Over the course of his career Roger starred in dozens of plays and musicals produced on Broadway and the West End of London. Broadway audiences cheered his performance of Gomez opposite the Morticia played by Bebe Neuwirth and Brooke Shields in *The Addams Family*, and raved about his portrayal of Anton Schell starring opposite Chita Rivera in *The Visit*. Television audiences know him from recurring roles on *The West Wing*, *Cheers* and *Grey's Anatomy*; and quest appearances on dozens of other shows.

Roger was also a prolific director who whose work graced the stages of many world-class theater companies including the Williamstown Theatre Festival where he served as the artistic director. A new generation of theatergoers were introduced to his extraordinary artistry when he teamed with Alex Timbers to direct *Peter and the Starcatcher* by Rick Elice, for which he won the Obie Award for Outstanding Direction Off-Broadway and then garnered nine Tony nominations, including one for Best Direction of a Play.

Throughout his life, Roger was a committed educator and generous mentor to young artists. From his earliest days as a fledgling with the Royal Shakespeare Company when he traveled to schools in the Cotswolds on Sundays, to the master-craftsman courses at Columbia University (adjunct professor), Williams College (Honorary Doctor of Fine Arts, 2006) and Florida State University (Hoffman Chair); from community outreach he began as Artistic Director of the Bristol Old Vic to the Leap-Frog internships he pioneered as Artistic Director of Williamstown Theater Festival, Roger spent countless hours in rehearsals and classrooms coaching aspiring writers, directors and performers on character, craft, collaboration and the vast cannon of theatrical works. The Roger Rees Award for Excellence in Student Performance continues his work.

Roger Rees passed away in July 2015 after a year-long battle with brain cancer. He was posthumously inducted into the American Theater Hall of Fame in November 2015. THEATRE EDUCATION IN THE TIME OF A PANDEMIC

arch 13, 2020–Friday the thirteenth–was the last day we had a "normal" day of school (although many would say nothing is normal when talking about schools). On that day, we had a dress rehearsal of *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat* at Islip High School (where I was working at the time), and everyone was looking forward to opening night the following week. Alas, it was not to be. What we thought would be a one or two week delay lasted until the end of the semester and, even now–a year later–audiences have yet to return in person to school performances.

Yet, in spite of the many, many disappointments to both the performing arts and education that we have experienced this past year, all has not been lost. Theatre educators are, by nature and by training, creative, and they have adapted to the Covid 19 situation in a variety of ways. They have learned to teach via Zoom, Google Classroom, Snapchat, and Flipgrid, as well as by using e mail, text, and phone. They have learned how to capture performances on

video and also to navigate the legal ramifications of doing so. They have encouraged and counselled students who have been overwhelmed by the disease and the isolation it has wrought. They have assisted students with college auditions that a re now either taped or done live over the computer.


The New York Thespians (the honor society for the theatre arts) recently held its annual festival online, and the presenters showed their inventiveness and resilience by teaching acting, singing, stage combat, makeup techniques, sound and lighting design, and dance via Zoom. While this manner of delivering instruction is not ideal, in the hands of innovative teachers, it works fine. Theatre teachers throughout the country have been delivering quality instruction in novel ways, and, although everyone cannot wait until in–person instruction resumes, they are making the best of a bad situation.

Actually, a bigger problem will be arriving in the new school year. School budgets are

prepared a year in a dvance, so this year's budgets were in place when the pandemic hit. Next year does not look good for schools, so it is important for parents and other community members to maintain pressure to ensure that the arts are adequately funded and do not bear the brunt of cuts.

There has also been an increased awareness of how theatre is more than entertainment; that it is a means of examining and dealing with oppression and inequality. Since theatre is based on conflict—no one goes to the theatre to see people agree with each other—theatre as a means of learning about conflict resolution goes back to the earliest surviving Greek dramas. By analyzing theatrical conflict, students can learn how to deal with the struggles—large and small—that they encounter in everyday life.

Theatre in the United States has survived disasters before—wars, unrest, censorship, and philistinism have all disrupted performances before. But it has always returned, and out of the hardship and conflict of the pandemic new (and greater) theatre will emerge.



Dr. Jeff S. Dailey retired in 2015 from his position as Director of Fine and Performing Arts in the Deer Park Schools. For the 2019–2020 school year, he filled in as an interim administrator for the arts in the Islip School District. His most recent article, "Performing Gilbert and Sullivan During a Pandemic and Beyond," was published in the April 2021 issue of School Music News. 


As the Wantagh International Thespian Society board secretary responsible for social media and design, I had the pleasure of designing the posters and Playbills for our shows this year.

Our advertising campaign looked quite different this year, due to the virtual nature of our shows. Our season consisted of an at-home adaptation of *Clue* and Rodgers and Hammerstein's *Cinderella*. I tried to create eye-catching poster designs in hopes of increasing our audience. We had two separate casts for *Clue*, so it was important to make each poster specific to their respective cast. I referenced movie posters that I found online in order to achieve this goal. During *Cinderella*, our spring musical, we had the privilege of returning to the stage and performing for a remote audience.

I wanted to exemplify the unique nature of our process by creating a poster that had never been done before. After much deliberation, I decided on a colorful background to create a magical feel, and the iconic carriage as the focal point of the poster. It was difficult to reach our prospective audiences due to the circumstances, so it was important to have online methods of advertising.

In order to create our Playbills, I was fortunate enough to have access to the PLAYBILLder program. This allowed us to reach our virtual audience and added a sense of normalcy to such a unique year. The software is incredibly easy to navigate, and enabled me to experience the process by which a real Playbill is created. My wonderful director, Mrs. Davis, was an enormous help through this year, and it was an absolute pleasure to work under her. As I make my exit from Wantagh Theatre, I am proud to have made my mark on the department with the help of the PLAYBILLder program.

ESSAY CONTEST GOES NATIONAL



"Every time that you call out, you're a little less alone."

"You Will Be Found", Dear Evan Hansen

"During the past year, connection has never been more integral to our daily lives, yet we find ourselves in a moment where it requires more creativity than ever to maintain."

So begins the prompt for Dear Evan Hansen's third-annual "You Will Be Found" College Essay Writing Challenge, which expanded to nationwide eligibility for the first time in 2021.

In their essays, students were asked to describe how they'd managed to ensure those around them were a little less alone in recent months—or, alternatively, a moment where they themselves found comfort in connection. Over the course of a two-month entry period, 3,277 students from 49 states, 3 US Territories and the US Armed Forces took the time to share their experiences through the essay challenge.

The college application process, and the essays that accompany it, have always played a role in Evan Hansen's story of a young adult coming into his own. That idea inspired the *Dear Evan Hansen* team to launch the essay challenge three years ago, awarding the first two scholarships to students in the greater New York City area.

The decision to expand eligibility was inspired by *Dear Evan Hansen*'s record-breaking National Tour, and the millions of audience members who have embraced the show nationwide since its debut. The growth of the essay challenge has been accomplished with the support of presenting partners at venues across the country. In a true collaborative effort, dozens of team members representing these theatres have served as preliminary judges,

each reading hundreds of essays from their respective regions to identify national finalists.

"Now, more than ever, we realize how the past year has impacted the educational experience for students across the country—and how those students have responded with incredible resilience and adaptability," says lead producer Stacey Mindich."We're grateful that the year ahead will ultimately find productions like *Dear Evan Hansen* on track to return to the stage, and students across the country able to get safely back to their classrooms."

The winner of the essay challenge, which is presented alongside *Dear Evan Hansen*'s longtime partners The Broadway Education Alliance and Gotham Writers Workshop, will receive a \$10,000 scholarship to the college of their choice. The winning student, along with national finalists, will also be hosted as VIP guests of *Dear Evan Hansen* as the production resumes performances on Broadway and on Tour at the end of this year.



GENE O'DONOVAN started as a scenic carpenter in 1970, progressing upward to shop foreman then General Manager/Vice President. He worked as a stagehand, automation operator, production carpenter, and house carpenter. In 1980, he founded Hudson Scenic Studio and was its President until 1994 when he opened Aurora Productions, a production management company. While at Hudson he production managed theater and corporate events. He retired from Aurora in January of 2015 but continues as a consultant. He has been involved in the building, technical supervision or production management of over 250 Broadway shows and their tours across four continents. Gene began O'Donovan Consulting which is presently advising the Nederlander Organization on the restoration of the Palace Theater. Gene has taught Production Management & Technical Theater at SUNY Purchase (2001–present) and Columbia University (2013-2018). He is the recipient of a TONY Honors Award For Excellence in Theater, a proud veteran of the Army, member of Locals One and 74 of the IATSE and is

married to Linda Batwin O'Donovan (Principle of Batwin+Robin Productions). They have five children and six grandchildren.

caley Beretta is the Manager of Creative Development at Disney Theatrical Group, shepherding the creation of new Broadway musicals (*Frozen*, *Aladdin*), regional, international, and developmental productions (*Hercules*, *Freaky Friday*, *The Jungle Book*, *The Hunchback of Notre Dame*) and the adaptation of titles for amateur licensing (Descendants, *Moana JR*.). In 2018, in collaboration with her Disney colleagues, Caley co-produced the landmark event Women's Day on Broadway at the New Amsterdam Theatre; she co-produced the event again in 2019 at the St. James Theatre. Caley started at DTG in 2013, after graduating with a B.A. in Communication from Northwestern University.

FRANK DILELLA When New Yorkers are looking for the latest on the city's vibrant theater scene, they turn to NY1 theater correspondent and host of "On Stage," Frank DiLella. A resident of the Upper West Side and native of Philly, Frank attended Fordham University at Lincoln Center and has returned to his alma mater as a professor. Frank began his time at NY1 in 2004 as an intern for "On Stage." After stints on the assignment desk and as a producer, Frank got his big break during the Broadway stagehand strike of 2007 where he was asked to lead NY1's coverage. He is the lead-producer of the musical Romantics Anonymous (Shakespeare's Globe Theatre and US Tour 2020) and co-founder of Radio Mouse Entertainment. 


