THE ROGER REES AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN STUDENT PERFORMANCE

celebrates the exceptional life and career-long artistic excellence of the beloved actor, artist and teacher, Roger Rees.



Roger Rees was born in Aberystwyth, Wales on May 5, 1944, and grew up in South London. He began his career in the theater as a scenery painter. While working backstage, the theater manager called upon him to replace an injured cast-member. He never painted scenery again.


He spent 22 years as a member of the Royal Shakespeare Company with whom he received the Olivier* and Tony* Awards for his performance in the title role in *The Life and Adventures of Nicholas Nickleby*. Roger continued as an Associate Artist of the RSC for the rest

of his life. Over the course of his career Roger starred in dozens of plays and musicals produced on Broadway and the West End of London. Broadway audiences cheered his performance of Gomez opposite the Morticia played by Bebe Neuwirth and Brooke Shields in *The Addams Family*, and raved about his portrayal of Anton Schell starring opposite Chita Rivera in *The Visit*. Television audiences know him from recurring roles on *The West Wing*, *Cheers* and *Grey's Anatomy*; and quest appearances on dozens of other shows.

Roger was also a prolific director who whose work graced the stages of many world-class theater companies including the Williamstown Theatre Festival where he served as the artistic director. A new generation of theatergoers were introduced to his extraordinary artistry when he teamed with Alex Timbers to direct *Peter and the Starcatcher* by Rick Elice, for which he won the Obie Award for Outstanding Direction Off-Broadway and then garnered nine Tony nominations, including one for Best Direction of a Play.


Throughout his life, Roger was a committed educator and generous mentor to young artists. From his earliest days as a fledgling with the Royal Shakespeare Company when he traveled to schools in the Cotswolds on Sundays, to the master-craftsman courses at Columbia University (adjunct professor), Williams College (Honorary Doctor of Fine Arts, 2006) and Florida State University (Hoffman Chair); from community outreach he began as Artistic Director of the Bristol Old Vic to the Leap-Frog internships he pioneered as Artistic Director of Williamstown Theater Festival, Roger spent countless hours in rehearsals and classrooms coaching aspiring writers, directors and performers on character, craft, collaboration and the vast cannon of theatrical works. The Roger Rees Award for Excellence in Student Performance continues his work.

Roger Rees passed away in July 2015 after a year-long battle with brain cancer. He was posthumously inducted into the American Theater Hall of Fame in November 2015. NATIONAL ESSAY CONTEST



DEAR EVAN HANSEN'S FOURTH-ANNUAL "YOU WILL BE FOUND" COLLEGE ESSAY WRITING CHALLENGE

In the Tony Award-winning musical *Dear Evan Hansen*, overstretched single mother Heidi speaks this line to her son Evan, the show's titular high school senior. Variations of this exchange undoubtedly take place at breakfast tables across America and beyond, as students and their families look with anticipation towards the formative experience of a college education, while also carefully considering its costs.

Inspired by this moment within the show, *Dear Evan Hansen* lead producer Stacey Mindich first had the idea for the production to sponsor an essay contest of its own and offer financial support to students in a similar stage of life to Evan and his peers.

"Dear Evan Hansen is a show rooted in authenticity," says Mindich. "Evan's Mom's struggle to afford college for her son is a very real issue. So it seemed like an important gesture from the show to sponsor this contest. And it gives the entire company such pleasure when a winner is chosen each year."

Launched in 2019 in collaboration with the Broadway Education Alliance and Gotham Writers Workshop, the *Dear Evan Hansen* College Essay Writing Challenge began as a program for the greater New York area. Having continued to expand in subsequent years, the 2022 contest extended eligibility to 11th and 12th grade students across North America, and the grand prize now totals \$10,000.

Since its inception, the contest has inspired more than 4,100 original student essays, engaging with themes relevant to the production ranging from reinvention to connection and mental wellbeing. While much has changed for the contest in its four years of growth, one thing has remained consistent—the staggering quality of the work shared by student participants.

"I thought to myself this year, 'maybe you're getting used to these raw, honest, beautiful stories from these smart, good-hearted kids," remarked contest facilitator Kelly Caldwell (Dean of Faculty, Gotham Writers) shortly after the 2022 contest went live. "Nope! It's day one and I'm already into the Kleenex!"

Caldwell also serves as a final round judge for the contest, reading entries alongside a crossindustry panel that features professionals from theater, film, publishing, journalism, medicine, and education.

Prior winners of the *Dear Evan Hansen* College Essay Writing Challenge have used their scholarships to attend institutions such as Princeton, Rice, and the Boston Conservatory, pursuing degrees in Economics, Architecture, Musical Theatre, and more. These past winners have also assumed roles as online contest ambassadors, seeking out prospective participants to offer advice and inspiration.



n 2021, I asked my musical theater teacher to enter my school's virtual production of *Songs* For A New World (where I played Man 1) into the Roger Rees Awards. I figured it couldn't hurt to go for it! The journey that followed was such an unexpected and amazing experience. After winning Best Actor in RRA, I went onto the Jimmy Awards, in which I competed with and met multiple insanely talented performers my age from all across the country. Of course because this all took place during the ongoing pandemic, everything was virtual. So, right after I finished the virtual aspect of the Jimmy Awards, I had gotten a callback for *Dear Evan Hansen*. Even crazier, the callback was the day before the full Jimmy Awards broadcast. It was an eventful week to say the least, but definitely worth all the craziness, because I was a finalist in the Jimmy Awards, and was cast as an understudy in *Dear Evan Hansen*!

When I officially joined the *Dear Evan Hansen* company and started rehearsals, I quickly learned about the true importance of understudies. First off, when a new member joins the

cast, understudies are used to rehearse them. Whether it's a new lead or a new understudy, we're there to help them as they learn the roles. In addition to this, many of us cover more than one role, meaning we have to learn multiple tracks. We are always backstage, ready to go on at all times, and that's not an exaggeration. I've seen my coworkers go on with a decent amount of notice, short notice, and very short notice. I've even seen them go on in the middle of shows. The role of an understudy is extremely important. We are vital to keeping a show running, especially in the ongoing pandemic. I'm very fortunate to have joined this company, and even more fortunate to get the chance to learn from all these amazing performers and be a part of the understudy family. It has been an incredible journey. I've learned many important lessons and have truly grown so much as a person and a performer, and it's all thanks to where it started, the Roger Rees Awards!
