THE ROGER REES AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN STUDENT PERFORMANCE

celebrates the exceptional life and career-long artistic excellence of the beloved actor, artist and teacher, Roger Rees.



Roger Rees was born in Aberystwyth, Wales on May 5, 1944, and grew up in South London. He began his career in the theater as a scenery painter. While working backstage, the theater manager called upon him to replace an injured cast-member. He never painted scenery again.

He spent 22 years as a member of the Royal Shakespeare Company with whom he received the Olivier and Tony Awards for his performance in the title role in *The Life and Adventures of Nicholas Nickleby*. Roger continued as an Associate Artist of the RSC for the rest

of his life. Over the course of his career Roger starred in dozens of plays and musicals produced on Broadway and the West End of London. Broadway audiences cheered his performance of Gomez opposite the Morticia played by Bebe Neuwirth and Brooke Shields in *The Addams Family*, and raved about his portrayal of Anton Schell starring opposite Chita Rivera in *The Visit*. Television audiences know him from recurring roles on *The West Wing*, *Cheers* and *Grey's Anatomy*; and guest appearances on dozens of other shows.

Roger was also a prolific director who whose work graced the stages of many world-class theater companies including the Williamstown Theatre Festival where he served as the artistic director. A new generation of theatergoers were introduced to his extraordinary artistry when he teamed with Alex Timbers to direct *Peter and the Starcatcher* by Rick Elice, for which he won the Obie Award for Outstanding Direction Off-Broadway and then garnered nine Tony nominations, including one for Best Direction of a Play.

Throughout his life, Roger was a committed educator and generous mentor to young artists. From his earliest days as a fledgling with the Royal Shakespeare Company when he traveled to schools in the Cotswolds on Sundays, to the master-craftsman courses at Columbia University (adjunct professor), Williams College (Honorary Doctor of Fine Arts, 2006) and Florida State University (Hoffman Chair); from community outreach he began as Artistic Director of the Bristol Old Vic to the Leap-Frog internships he pioneered as Artistic Director of Williamstown Theater Festival, Roger spent countless hours in rehearsals and classrooms coaching aspiring writers, directors and performers on character, craft, collaboration and the vast cannon of theatrical works. The Roger Rees Award for Excellence in Student Performance continues his work.

Roger Rees passed away in July 2015 after a year-long battle with brain cancer. He was posthumously inducted into the American Theater Hall of Fame in November 2015. 




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CELEBRATING NYC



2025 marks the 400th anniversary of New York City and the 15th anniversary of the Roger Rees Awards. That confluence of milestones is certainly worthy of celebration. And since we're theater kids, how do we celebrate? With a little song and dance, of course!

As the curtain rises, you'll hear a few familiar tunes as all 50 Outstanding Performer nominees take the stage to perform the opening number, accompanied by this year's New York City Center High School Orchestra Award winner, the student orchestra from Fiorello H. LaGuardia High School of Music & Art and Performing Arts. The song, arranged by Broadway music director Rick Hip-Flores, is a medley of show tunes about the greatest city in the world...New York, New York.

"For four centuries, history has happened here. And in 2025, through our 'Founded By NYC' campaign, we will celebrate all those who came here from around the world over those 400 years to build our great city—the New Yorkers whose vibrant culture, innovation, and abilities continue to make us the envy of the world today," said Mayor Eric Adams in a statement.

The performing arts are integral to the New York City landscape. From world-renowned operas and symphony orchestras to acclaimed ballet companies and our beloved Broadway, the city's many stages draw visitors—and aspiring artists—from around the globe. But the students you'll meet tonight already wake up every day in the city that doesn't sleep. "This opening number is a true celebration of the students, the orchestra, and New York City," says

Broadway Education Alliance Creative Director Theo Lencicki. "We're right in Broadway's back

yard. New York is the dream. And for these kids, the dream is their home."

For the second year, The Roger Rees Awards is teaming up with New York City Center to present the orchestral award. "New York City Center has become an invaluable partner to us," says Lencicki. "Over the past two years, their support has helped us broaden our programming by celebrating talented students across a range of industry disciplines—both on and off the stage."

Hip-Flores is also returning for a second year to conduct the student orchestra. He has conducted 15 Broadway shows—"the vast majority of them have been pop shows, either jukebox musicals or very contemporary-sounding original shows," he says. But he also loves classic musical theater, so his arrangement is a mix of Broadway periods and styles, from "Another Hundred People" by Stephen Sondheim to "Empire State of Mind" by Alicia Keys ("which you can't walk around Times Square without hearing," he jokes). Listen closely for his favorite Easter egg tucked way into the medley, "(We'll Take) Manhattan" by Rodgers and Hart. "I only have one line of it. It's deep in the song, in a particularly busy mash-up section, but I wanted to include it because it was published exactly 100 years ago and it's one of the most iconic New York songs."

Another title is woven into the song-by John Kander and Lin-Manuel Miranda-that perfectly captures the spirit of the evening: "Cheering for Me Now." And to all of tonight's performers, we say: Yes. Yes, we are.

MACGYVERS AND MIRACLE WORKERS

THE ROGER REES AWARDS CELEBRATES THEATER EDUCATORS WITH THE INAUGURAL AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN INNOVATIVE THEATER ARTS EDUCATION

For a decade I led a workshop at the International Thespian Festival titled "So, You Think You Want to Be a Theater Teacher," and the turnout each year filled me with hope. I would start by asking students to describe their theater teacher using just one word. Some shared responses: "Dedicated," "Inspirational," "MacGyver," "Innovator," "Advocate," and "Unsupported."

Students are perceptive—they value teachers who believe in them and who are dedicated to excellence. They also notice when those hard-working teachers lack the support they deserve. I asked a student what she meant by "MacGyver," and she explained, "Like the character from the TV show—when we're missing something we need, my theater teacher always finds a creative way to make it, using whatever we have on hand." Theater teachers exemplify dedication, advocacy, and innovation.

For fifteen years, the Roger Rees Awards have celebrated and encouraged student achievement in theater. It's fitting, then, to now shine a spotlight on

the educators who inspire and guide those students—honoring their creativity, dedication, and lasting impact with the Broadway Education Alliance Award for Excellence in Innovative Theater Arts Education presented in collaboration with Theatrical Rights Worldwide and Broadway Inbound. In recognition of this spirit, TRW extends heartfelt congratulations to the first recipient of this prestigious honor, Lisa Drance.

An instructor at North Babylon High School in Suffolk County, Drance and her students have been participants in the Roger Rees Awards since its inception. She is the embodiment of the new educator award, created to recognize those who demonstrate the remarkable ability to identify opportunities, think creatively, and transform ideas into successful programs. These teachers are imaginative, passionate, and a driving force behind positive change within their organization—providing students a stage on which to explore their dreams and a platform for building value within their community.

A high school theater teacher's job is demanding and often emotional. It blends full-time teaching with managing an after-school theater company. Over time, all theater teachers inevitably experience heartbreak, feel frustrated by school bureaucracy, and encounter student apathy or lack of dedication. Yet, these extraordinary educators are deeply moved and motivated enough to come back and do it all over again.

It is a role filled with challenges, but also incredible moments of joy and fulfillment. It goes beyond teaching technique; they must nurture a student's inner artistic voice. While some students may pursue their dreams confidently, others may not, simply because no one told them their spark matters.

Though some students go on to careers in the performing arts, most pursue paths outside the industry. A high school theater program must therefore serve both future artists and those simply seeking a creative outlet. Theater education isn't just for training professionals; it's about fostering creativity, empathy, and expression in all students. The goal is to nurture not only future performers and directors, but also thoughtful, imaginative arts supporters, and the next generation of empathetic, creative adults.

When Grammy Award winner and co-author of *The Color Purple*, Allee Willis, learned that her hometown's Cass High School in Detroit was staging the musical, she eagerly requested tickets through TRW. However, just days before opening, she called in a panic after watching the Sunday tech rehearsal, describing it as a disaster with missed light cues, faulty mics, and chaotic scene changes. She insisted, "You

need to shut the show down."

Despite her concerns, my response was calm and confident: the show would go on. Allee was asked not to return until Friday night's performance, where she would attend as the guest of honor.

The following Monday, Allee called again, this time in awe: "I don't get it. How did that chaotic rehearsal on Sunday become a profoundly beautiful production that brought me to tears by Friday? It was a miracle!" The answer? What takes three to four weeks on Broadway must be accomplished in just three to four days in high school theater—all while teachers are still handling classes, grading, and cafeteria duty. Allee's response captured the heart of the profession: "Then high school theater teachers are miracle workers," said Allee.

Theater educators take great pride in the successes of their former students. However, many are now expressing growing concerns about being overworked, under-supported, and disheartened by political decisions affecting education. Therefore, this is an important time to support and advocate for arts educators everywhere. Theater teachers are miracle workers. They create a space for creativity, vulnerability, and growth in ways that stay with students for life. They often see potential before the student sees it, and they give them the courage to take the stage and to find their voice, both literally and metaphorically.

If there is a teacher who created a safe place for you to get your story started, let them know. While your words of gratitude may not be expected, they will be appreciated. Never doubt the power of encouraging words.
